SAMUEL CARNES,

An Old Soldier and Pioneer, of Montgomery, Ohio, Dead.

Samuel Carnes, an old soldier and pioneer citizen of Montgomery, Ohio, was laid to rest in Hopewell Cemetery, near there, last Tuesday. He was born in Symmes Township and reared by his uncle, Thomas Long. He served throughout the war as a member of the Fifth Ohio Cavalry and the Second Ohio Heavy Artillery, and, on his return to Montgomery, was a tailor there for a long time.

He died at his home in Chicago, August 29, and in accordance with his earnest desire his body was brought to Hopewell for burial. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Lowry at the Presbyterian Church in the presence of many old-time friends. He was in his sixty-eighth year, and leaves a widow, Jane Carnes (nee Forden), two daughters, Mrs. Theodore Todd and Mrs. Lewis Kortos, of Chicago, and three sons, E. J. Carnes, of Chicago; Albert Menter Carnes, of Colorado, and B. F. Carnes, of New York. He had musical talent, and was a musician. One son was named after Albert Menter, the great band leader, who was murdered in Newport, Ky., soon after the close of the war.

He had been almost totally disabled for five or six years, but received only \$6 per month as a pension. He was a kind-hearted man and a good citizen.
